This guide contains information on keeping you, your organisation and community as safe as possible during these troubled times.

Safety Guidance & Resources

- Be vigilant of individuals gathering outside or near your building.
- Identify where there is a safe space for people to wait in case there is a disruptive presence, it is useful to consider spaces which do not have windows, or which have a far enough distance from windows to protect from entry or breakage.
- Take steps to check that your organisation has clear, fire resilient lock down procedures.
- Ensure that no one is working alone in the building and a manager is able to check on the location and safety of staff members and occupants.
